The Pieve also preserves a terracotta statue depicting the Archangel Gabriel, which was recently attributed to Leonardo da Vinci by Professor Carlo Pedretti: Leonardo, in fact, is said to have stayed in this area while carrying out hydraulic engineering studies.

- **Culture and Traditions:**** The hamlet is known for its local traditions and the welcoming atmosphere, typical of small Tuscan villages. Restaurants and wine bars offer local gastronomic specialties, making San Gennaro an ideal place to savor Tuscan cuisine.
